The Town of Lisbon had a very busy 2018 and we don't plan on slowing down any time soon! Last fall, the inside of Town Hall had a makeover with new carpet and a fresh coat of paint. We rearranged part of the office around, which opened it up and allowed us to open up the second counter window for tax collection, which went very smooth! Waukesha State Bank now will issue you a refund (up to \$500) on the spot when you pay your property taxes next December. If you chose to pay in two installments, please make sure you pay the second half to Waukesha County, either by mail, online or in person at the Waukesha County Treasurer's Office by July 31.

We have made some changes to the dog licensing process. If you licensed your dog(s) in 2018, you were mailed a renewal letter, with a link to pay for the license online. Many of you took advantage of that, thank you!! If you haven't licensed your dog yet, you have until March 31 to do so. After that there is a \$10 per dog late fee.

This spring, we will be upgrading the audio/visual equipment in the meeting room to make it easier for our residents to watch the Town Board and Plan Commission meetings on Channel 14 AND we'll be streaming meetings live on YouTube!! Stay tuned to the Town's website and Facebook page for updates on that.

The Town is also starting some new events for the residents. First up, we are working with Refrigerant Depot and adding a free appliance drop-off in conjunction with the annual Tire-Round Up which is held at the Public Works Department. The appliance drop-off addition is a pilot program and if all goes well, we'll see what other times of the year we can offer it again. The Park Committee is also introducing our very first Community Picnic in Lisbon Community Park where there will be musical entertainment, food and beer vendors to bring friends and family together.

The elected officials and staff are looking forward to accomplishing our goals and continuing to improve the way we help our residents. Here's to another great year in Lisbon!

The Lisbon Fire Department is looking for energetic, motivated, and dedicated members. A Department that was created in 1982 with 30 Paid on Call members is now entering a new transition stage of becoming a career/part time fire department having 5 full time members and 42 paid on call members around the clock. The Town of Lisbon is rapidly growing and in turn giving more opportunities for everyone to be a part of something big! Currently the Lisbon Fire Department staffs Paramedics, Critical Care Paramedics, EMT's, and Fire Fighters to respond to 911 EMS calls, Fire calls, mutual aid into other communities, and is working closely with Community Memorial Hospital doing Critical Care transports.

As calls continue to increase for Lisbon Fire Department and surrounding fire departments, our communities around the area are working together more than ever with the same common purpose of making our community safer. With that being said, Lisbon along with our neighboring Fire Departments are training together which gives experience from a variety of leaders from the area helping you to achieve your goals. Lisbon provides opportunities for schooling by offering the option to have it paid for rather it be starting off with EMT, Fire fighter 1, or continuing on to Paramedic.



Whether you live in town or out of town, residency is not an issue. Lisbon offers bunk rooms to sleep in overnight, a workout room, a day room for cooking and being with your crew. For Town residents that can make it to the station in an appropriate amount of time, Lisbon Fire Department gives the option to respond from home during an on call shift.

As the Town of Lisbon continues to grow, the amount of 911 calls will increase, the demand for more ambitious members will rise. Already having members from all over the county, we look forward to seeing new faces join our family.

Fire Address Numbers

Residents are encouraged to use fire address signs on their property. These address signs help our Fire Department and the Police with locating a resident's and business's address. Fire address signs also help the post office and other means of deliveries to locate addresses. These address signs can be purchased for \$20.00 at Town Hall and need to be placed within the parameters of the Town's Building Code as indicated below.

CHAPTER 30 – BUILDING CODE (c) Affixing Numbers

Whenever any residence or place of business shall be erected or occupied in the Town of Lisbon, it shall be the duty of the owner or occupant to procure the correct number and street name from the Building Inspector and, prior to occupancy of any residence or place of business, install, or cause to be installed those numbers on the premises parallel to the side of the street on which the home and/or business is located; in a place clearly visible from the road, no more than 25 feet from the edge of the road pavement; with-in ten (10) feet of either side edge of the driveway; between two (2) feet and five (5) feet above the finished grade at the point of installation. Homes and businesses sharing a common driveway or located on a private road shall have numbers at the intersection with the public road, at each split, fork, or intersection thereafter, and on the property itself as specified in this ordinance.

Michael L. Grotz is the Assessor for the Town of Lisbon. The Assessor is responsible for discovering, listing, and valuing all real and personal property. He also inspects and values all of the building permits taken out for such things as new homes, additions, garages, remodeling, decks and other improvement projects.

The Assessor and his assistant, Judy Hassmann, have accumulated building permits and land divisions to review and inspect for the 2019 assessment year. Inspections began in December 2018 and will continue until complete. Personal Property notices were mailed to all business owners on January 7, 2019 and need to be returned to our office by March 1, 2019.

All of the Town of Lisbon property files are kept at the office of Grotz Appraisals located at N88 W16573 Main St. in Menomonee Falls. In 2018, we received a total of 751 permits, 34 new homes and 1 new commercial building. Please remember that all types of construction in the Town of Lisbon require a permit. Applications and submittal information can be found on our Town's website, or contact me, and I will get an application, or information to you. If you have a private on-site septic system, and your improvement is outside the foot print of your home, you will also need to contact Waukesha County Health Department at 262-896-8300 for a preliminary site evaluation. Permitting is also required for kitchen and bath remodels, service upgrades, window and roof replacement, water heaters, furnace and air conditioners. In an emergency situation, hire a reputable, licensed contractor, and then obtain your permit as soon as practical. If you have any questions, or are unsure if you need a permit, please call, Monday through Friday 8:30AM to 4:30PM. Have a safe and enjoyable project.

From the desk of the Sheriff's Department

Doorbell cameras, installed near a home's front entrance, are catching on in popularity due to the added security and convenience they provide.

How do doorbell cameras work?

A doorbell camera works by allowing you to view live video of whoever is outside your door, without having to open the door, move a curtain or peak through a window. Doorbell cameras allow you to discreetly view who is at the door without making your presence known. Not only does this make it possible to screen your door visitors the same way caller ID works for your phone calls, but you also don't have to let a stranger or potential intruder know you are home. You can view a live video image from outside your front door. You can watch your video feed from a phone, tablet or other devices. It is more subtle than a security camera while still providing the functionality of a doorbell.

There are many benefits to having doorbell cameras:

1. Deter and Catch Burglars

Avoid break-ins or theft by installing doorbell cameras in plain sight. Cameras warn burglars that an alarm and security system is in place, acting as a deterrent to crime. This can be especially helpful where packages are routinely delivered to people's homes and left unattended on the front stoop.

Many cameras also include features, such as high-definition resolution and saved images, which can help law enforcement should an incident occur. Keep better tabs on your home via live camera feeds online and mobile alerts when motion is detected.

2. No Guessing WHO IS THERE

Check who is at the door before answering or when you (or your family - children or elderly parents) aren't home. In addition to video footage, many doorbell cameras also enable audio control through an intercom. This lets you communicate with those at the door without opening it—a cool safety feature for when you're home alone or someone seems suspicious.

Doorbell cameras can be great at night too. Using infrared or LED technology, some cameras with night-vision capabilities are able to capture high-resolution footage of anyone near a home's entrance—regardless of the time of day. This is helpful if expecting evening guests or trying to identify the cause of a nighttime disturbance.

3. Increase Home Value

Buyers are showing more interest in smart homes, specifically security and safety technologies. Homes enabled with smart technology close faster than those without it. Therefore, in addition to current safety benefits, cameras may also pay off should your family decide to move.

Help us protect our neighborhoods, if you do capture video of a suspect, do not post it on social media right away. Police say all the Facebook exposure could hurt their investigation. Instead call them first (262-446-5070) and let them pick up the case.

BRUSH PICK-UP

The Town of Lisbon Public Works Department will begin the Spring Brush Pick-up on Monday April 15, 2019 (tentative/weather permitting)

All brush must be out by the road at 7:00 A.M. that morning.

Only one pass through the Town will be made which will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks to complete. Any brush brought out after this time will not be picked up and will be the owner's responsibility to remove. **Due to budget and time constraints, there is NO FALL BRUSH PICKUP.**

- No branches will be picked up that are over 8 feet in length. Small branches should be tied together with string.
- Branches over 5 inches in diameter should be cut up and used for firewood.
- All branches should be neatly stacked with butt ends facing the road.
- The crew will not pick up from vacant lots or new construction.
- No stumps, railroad ties or landscape timbers are allowed.
- No garden or yard waste, bagged, boxed or other containers of brush will be picked up. Please take these items to the Compost Site.

Please do not drop brush off at the Department of Public Works.

WASTE OIL & ANTI-FREEZE



There is a depository tank for waste oil located at the Municipal Garage at N72W24958 Good Hope Road.

ONLY waste oil is to be deposited in this receptacle for recycling. You may also recycle your oil filters at this location. Also at this site is a receptacle for used anti-freeze. We will accept the synthetic type of anti-freeze. Please be very careful to place these in the properly marked receptacles. It will cost the Town extra to haul away contaminated products.

RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENTS

The Town of Lisbon prohibits the placement of obstruction and encroachments within the public right-of-way. The public right-of-way is the land containing street pavement and the grass ditch line from the shoulder to the front of the property line.

Obstructions are described as trees, landscape plantings, fences, posts, poles, temporary signs, bagged yard waste or rocks.

Encroachments include fixed items such as buildings, structures, pedestal signs or hanging signs.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Overnight parking on all Town Streets is prohibited between 2 AM and 6 AM To receive overnight parking permission, you MUST call 262-246-5237 voicemail option #1. Leave your name, vehicle make, model, type, and license plate, phone number, and address where your vehicle will be parked. Failure to call for permission will result in a parking citation. Permission is limited except when extenuating circumstances arise like driveway repairs.

BURNING PERMITS

We mailed burn permits with tax bills in December. Simply read the ordinance, sign and date the permit and keep it. If you are a renter, permits are available at the town hall. Burning permits expire yearly on December 31 and are required for any outdoor burning, this includes backyard bonfires as well as portable fire pits.

To find out if the compost site is open due to weather, please call 262-719-5411. The annual pass obtainable at the Town Hall is \$18.00. There is an additional \$2.00 handling fee if done by mail or a \$0.88 fee for credit card payments. Credit card payments are only accept at Town Hall..

REMINDER TO NOT DEPOSIT DEBRIS ON THE ROAD

It is a town ordinance (3.04a) to not deposit any foreign matter, which grass clippings and leaves would be considered, on any town roads. They pose a safety concern for people on bicycles and motorcycles.

It is easy to prevent the clippings from flying into the street by mowing with the discharge chute aimed back at the yard. If you don't want the clippings in your yard, just rake them up. They do add nutrients to your lawn if left alone. It's inevitable that some grass will fly astray and end up on the roadway, that's understandable. But when there are clumps and piles, that is blatant disregard for others safety.

Be a good neighbor and make certain that you don't leave clippings in the street. Use a blower and blow them back into your yard or use a broom and sweep them up, or cut in a manner that the grass gets thrown away from the street.

If you submit your dog license application on or after April 1, please add a \$10 PER DOG late fee to your payment. Don't forget to include a copy of your dog's rabies vaccination certificate.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING COLLECTION

All residents receive up-the-drive service from Advanced Disposal. This means residents do not have to bring garbage bins to the end of the drive way. They should be set out in front of your garage door.

Please make sure there are no vehicles in the way of the garbage truck as they enter the driveway or in the way of the trash cans. This service saves homeowners the burden of walking cans down long driveways.

Garbage collection will be delayed one day for the following holidays: Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day.
