When are we incorporating? This is the number one question I get asked by residents. I wish it was a question I could just give a date on. The process for incorporation is a complex one for Lisbon. The past couple years we have been working on a twofold approach to incorporate. We were trying to use a law that allowed a town to statutorily incorporate if we met certain criteria. With the eminent opposition by the Village of Sussex to any attempt by Lisbon to incorporate, the use of this law was what we viewed as our most cost-effective way of incorporating. Unfortunately, we will not be able to use this law because of the sunset clause built into it. That will put Lisbon down the path of attempting a conventional type of incorporation. We will work with the Department of Administration and with our willing neighbors to get this done as soon as is possible. I want to thank our good neighbors in the Villages of Merton and Lannon for being very supportive of our incorporation goal. Lisbon will not forget our good friends and I look forward to working with them in the future.

Lisbon is currently working with the Village of Merton to combine our Fire Departments to form the Bark River Fire Department. This pending merger is a shining example of the good cooperation between Merton and Lisbon. Lisbon Fire Chief Doug Brahm explains more about the benefits of this merger in his article.

Lisbon's Compost site will be moving at some point in 2020. Payne and Dolan have once again donated use of their land for the compost site. The site will be moving west close to the corner of STH 164 and Plainview Road. We will announce the move and when it is happening on our website, www.townoflisbon-wi.com, Channel 14 (Spectrum Cable Service) and the Facebook page, www.facebook.com/lisbonwi/. Compost site users will also receive a flyer when they use the site. A big thank you to Payne and Dolan for the generous use of their land for our residents.

One of County's Most Dangerous Intersections Will See Safety Improvements
Roundabout Construction on CTH Q and Hillside set for 2023

West Bend, WI – After being marked as one of the most dangerous intersections in the County's 2019 Traffic Safety Analysis Plan, the intersection of County Highway Q (County Line Road) & Hillside Road will be reconstructed with a new roundabout.

"A roundabout will address the severe angle crashes observed at this location," said Highway Commissioner Scott Schmidt. "We're in the business of providing safe, efficient and effective mobility and this is an exciting project for those reasons."

2013-2018 saw 37 accidents at the intersection. With support from the Village of Richfield and the Town of Lisbon, Washington County applied for and obtained Highway Safety Improvement funding for the project from the federal/state government in the amount of \$1,620,000. The remaining \$180,000 of the project will be funded through local contributions.

The Village of Richfield has been assisting in monitoring crash data at this intersection for years and had made temporary modifications as part of the STH 164 reconstruction efforts, only allowing right-turn movement from Hillside Road. As part of intersection safety priorities in 2019, Washington County reached out to SEWRPC and Department of Transportation Safety engineers for further review. The conclusion: a bigger step is needed for to make this intersection safe.

"We're elated that Washington County secured this grant to address this long-standing safety concern," said Village of Richfield Administrator Jim Healy. "We'll be working throughout the construction process to ensure that our residents have ample opportunity for feedback and discussion on plan design."

Town of Lisbon Administrator, Gina Gresch added the following, "We are delighted to see Washington County feels this project is important enough to approve funding to improve this intersection for the safety of our residents and everyone traveling through our communities."


THE PROBLEM: HIGH NUMBER OF CRASHES AND CRASH RATE

From Lisbon Sanitary District #1

During 2019 the Lisbon Sanitary District #1 (District) incurred large expenditures of funds related to repair and maintenance of the District's System and infiltration of storm water into the sanitary sewer system. These expenditures depleted the cash reserves of the District to the point that the District was no longer able to subsidize the quarterly billing rates for residents. For the last five plus years the District has held rate increases down using cash reserves to maintain the operations of the system.

The combination of depleted reserves and the true level of operating expenses of the District required that the District increase the quarterly rate from \$105.00 to \$220.00 per quarter. No one is pleased with the increase; however, it was required to continue to operate the system effectively and keep the system in good repair.

The District commissioners have determined that part of the cash flow issue of 2019 related to a failed transducer that was reporting a greater level of sewage to the Sussex Sewer Utility than was taking place. This transducer is being repaired and the District is claiming a refund from the Sussex Sewer Utility. It will take some time, however; the Commissioners are cautiously optimistic that the funds can be recovered. The impact of the claim on future rates is undetermined and will remain unknown until the claim is resolved.

In the interim we encourage everyone to help us minimize storm water infiltration. You can help the District by if you see a man-hole cover missing or water pooling in a yard by reporting what you see to the District. Also, never hook up sump pumps to the sanitary sewer system.

From the desk of the Lisbon Fire Department



The Lisbon Fire Department (FD) was mustered in 1982 and built to the specific requirements for our service area and our citizens. The Department has faithfully answered every call, without fail, since January 1, 1983, after responding to its very first call. When we were formed it was to provide a higher level of service than what was previously offered. It also was done under a budget directed by our own Town's governance.

Our mission statement, *"The Lisbon Fire Department was founded in 1982 to meet the specific fire and rescue needs of the people of Lisbon. Lisbon Fire department is committed to maintaining a state of readiness to meet the needs of the community. Lisbon Fire department is proud to be a leader among peer departments, meeting challenges with determination"*. We have successfully accomplished that mission and with profound attention to economic responsibility. The members of this department through the last 38 years have given an immeasurable amount of hours of dedication to serve the Lisbon residents and our guests. The officers, both present and past, have sacrificed an incredible amount of time and effort to provide and maintain this service. The Town's elected officials and administrations, for the most part, have always supported and provided for the needs of our department. **The Lisbon Fire Department has grown and continuously embraced change to provide the highest level of service possible. It is time again to revise operations in order to expand and advance services to continually meet the critical needs of those we serve.**

The Town of Lisbon and the Village of Merton are working to merge our fire departments. The goal would be to complete this consolidation in 2020. This partnership will provide a new pathway enabling us to restructure how our departments are staffed. Our existing model is a combination of a few full-time, several part-time, and a majority of paid-on-call staff. This operation is similar to a traditional volunteer type system. This paid-on-call model is no longer sustainable and will fail to provide consistent reliable service in the future. Combining resources at this time will allow us to place a minimum of fully trained personnel at each of our stations around the clock. This model of paid full time and part-time firefighter/paramedics based at our stations is a foundation for eventual growth toward a fully career staffed department. By reallocating our current levels of spending and rearranging or eliminating some of our equipment, we can reduce response times, improve outcomes, and assure uninterrupted service. Our fire and EMS responses have been dramatically increasing and requiring more sophisticated interventions and technical skills from our responders. Our communities are not financially capable of providing an immediate full time staffed department. But we do need to adopt a plan to transition to one over time. Lisbon's Fire Department and elected officials know that with changing demands, growth, and residents' expectations we need a significantly different operation model.

Some ask why now, and not prior to now? There are several reasons why the timing of this project is an important factor that will lead to the eventual success of the merger. Merton and Lisbon are neighbors that have provided mutual aid to each other since the establishment of the Lisbon FD. Merton FD and its community have always been ready to help and partner with Lisbon FD unconditionally. When Lisbon FD was established not all bordering departments were friendly. In fact, several worked hard to prevent the department from happening. In those days, Merton did not have all the same levels of services or equipment. They also responded to less calls and were content with their service meeting their needs. The Merton FD elected a different path in the 80's and 90's. They contracted with neighbors to their west for advanced levels of EMS. Lisbon during those years developed independently and elected to specialize in advanced life support. Lisbon was the first in the Community Memorial Hospital (now Froedtert Menomonee Falls) area to obtain critical care advanced life support credentials. More recently, Merton has enlisted Lisbon to provide higher levels of EMS care to them through a contract which is mutually beneficial to both municipalities. We have combined all of our training programs and are currently integrating our personnel. Lisbon sponsors Merton people through paramedic school and then those paramedics respond to Merton calls and provide back up for Lisbon calls. The major identifying differences between now and then is the amount of time our departments have naturally evolved and grown together. The personnel from both agencies work together seamlessly and across all the stations.

Waukesha County sponsored a study to research possible solutions to staffing issues across all of the County departments. Lisbon and Merton were mentioned in the findings as a recommended model fostering cluster departments throughout the County. Lake Country FD and Western Lakes FD are districts and examples of communities that have already moved forward combining resources.

The Lisbon FD and the Merton FD will be under one district named "Bark River Fire". We have been working on this project for some time now, but it is drawing closer to a reality. Lisbon residents will still have paramedic service and both fire stations will remain open. The onsite station staffing will improve along with response times. There is much work yet to be completed. Creating a shared department with municipalities that actually like and want to work with each other is refreshing. Both Merton and Lisbon are committed to work diligently toward a common goal for the good of their constituents. The fire and rescue service offered to Lisbon and Merton citizens will be changing and is guaranteed to be improved. I am excited for our new fire service future. Michael L. Grotz is the Assessor for the Town of Lisbon. The Assessor is responsible for discovering, listing, and valuing all real and personal property. He also inspects and values all of the building permits taken out for such things as new homes, additions, garages, remodeling, decks and other improvement projects.

The Assessor and his assistant, Judy Hassmann, have accumulated building permits and land divisions to review and inspect for the 2020 assessment year. Inspections began in December 2019 and will continue until complete. Personal Property notices were mailed to all business owners on January 6, 2020 and need to be returned to our office by March 1, 2020.

All of the Town of Lisbon property files are kept at the office of Grotz Appraisals located at N88 W16573 Main St. in Menomonee Falls. All types of construction, and some appliance replacements in the Town of Lisbon require a permit. This includes but is not limited to: home or garage additions, remodeling, out-buildings to include sheds or detached garages, decks, service upgrade, siding, roofing, window replacement, water heater and furnace replacement, and swimming pools.

Any accessory building, including those considered temporary, must also be permitted. No accessory building can be located in front of the home without proper approvals. Any accessory building over 100 square feet must have a concrete slab. The front of the home is defined as the side that faces the street. In the case of a corner lot, you are considered to have two front yards.

Applications can be found on the town's web site as well as answers to most of your permitting questions. If you have any additional questions, or are unsure if you need a permit, please call, Monday through Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm. Office hours are by appointment only.

From the desk of DPW Director Joe DeStefano Jr.

On a quiet February day I write this letter. We are in the midst of the winter season and are somewhat average for snow totals thus far. Last year we had a very busy late winter season for snow and ice control operations, we will see what the rest of this winter has in store for us. That being said, we have had a very successful and safe snow and ice control season to this point.

In 2020 you will notice pavement resurfacing along sections of Maple Avenue as well as Plainview Road taking place. We will also continue to focus on road maintenance as we move forward to preserve our investment. There will be crack-filling and chip-sealing taking place on various roads throughout Town. You will continue to see the guys out on the streets performing our regular duties of sign maintenance, roadside mowing, brush pick-up, tree removal, small road repairs, ditching, storm sewer repair, etc.

The Town's Compost Site will be moving roughly a half mile west of its current location. That should take place sometime in the summer of 2020, there is still a lot of work to take place to have it up and running properly.

Within the newsletter please find information on our annual spring brush pick-up, the compost site, the tire round-up, recycling, debris in the road and town right-of-ways. REMINDER TO NOT DEPOSIT DEBRIS ON THE ROAD

It is a town ordinance (3.04a) to not deposit any foreign matter, which grass clippings and leaves would be considered, on any town roads. They pose a safety concern for people on bicycles and motorcycles.

It is easy to prevent the clippings from flying into the street by mowing with the discharge chute aimed back at the yard. If you don't want the clippings in your yard, just rake them up. They do add nutrients to your lawn if left alone. It's inevitable that some grass will fly astray and end up on the roadway, that's understandable. But when there are clumps and piles, that is blatant disregard for others safety.

Be a good neighbor and make certain that you don't leave clippings in the street. Use a blower and blow them back into your yard or use a broom and sweep them up, or cut in a manner that the grass gets thrown away from the street.

RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENTS

The Town of Lisbon prohibits the placement of obstruction and encroachments within the public right-of-way. The public right-of-way is the land containing street pavement and the grass ditch line from the shoulder to the front of the property line.

Obstructions are described as trees, landscape plantings, fences, posts, poles, temporary signs, bagged yard waste or rocks.

Encroachments include fixed items such as buildings, structures, pedestal signs or hanging signs.



WASTE OIL & ANTI-FREEZE

There is a depository tank for waste oil located at the Municipal Garage at N72W24958 Good Hope Road.

ONLY waste oil is to be deposited in this receptacle for recycling. You may also recycle your oil filters at this

location. Also at this site is a receptacle for used anti-freeze. We will accept the synthetic type of anti-freeze. Please be very careful to place these in the properly marked receptacles. It will cost the Town extra to haul away contaminated products.

BRUSH PICK-UP

The Town of Lisbon Public Works Department will begin the Spring Brush Pick-up on Monday April 20, 2020 (tentative/weather permitting)

All brush must be out by the road at 7:00 A.M. that morning.

Only one pass through the Town will be made which will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks to complete. Any brush brought out after this time will not be picked up and will be the owner's responsibility to remove. **Due to budget and time constraints, there is NO FALL BRUSH PICKUP.**

- No branches will be picked up that are over 8 feet in length. Small branches should be tied together with string.
- Branches over 5 inches in diameter should be cut up and used for firewood.
- All branches should be neatly stacked with butt ends facing the road.
- The crew will not pick up from vacant lots or new construction.
- No stumps, railroad ties or landscape timbers are allowed.
- No garden or yard waste, bagged, boxed or other containers of brush will be picked up. Please take these items to the Compost Site.

Please do not drop brush off at the Department of Public Works.
